Tumbleweed, a plant that breaks off from its roots at the end of its life and is then blown around on the ground by the wind, is a common sight in some parts of North America. Motorists driving down this highway often have to deal with winds tossing the shrubs into the road, but this invasion was very unusual! The plants were so thick that the road had to be closed in both directions for hours and snow ploughs had to be used to clear the scene. Last year, tumbleweeds in California piled high enough to trap residents in their homes.
