Worship Theme

The children were challenged to think about which fruits of the spirit forgiveness links to. The children had a go at writing their own acrostic poems for FORGIVE.

The complex issue of forgiveness around inappropriate behaviour was touched upon with our older children. Forgiveness in some situations does not mean you cannot put boundaries in place to keep you safe.

School Uniform

The school's uniform is a unisex uniform and any items can be worn by either gender Please note 'G/W' next to an item of clothing means this is available at Grays and Whitakers uniform shop. Other items, if available and unbranded, can be bought from any shop.

Year EYFS to Year 5:

This will enable adequate healing time fore returning to school at the start of the school year
