What is forgiveness?


Why is forgiving important? Why?

National Education Union—Strike Action

As you know that members of the Education union, the NEU, have voted in favour of strike action.

Having completed a risk assessment and considering multiple factors, school will be shut to all children on Wednesday 1st February. I have had to make this decision based on the information I have at present and the

want to give you as much time as possible to plan. If anything changes on a national level or I am made aware of staffing changes in school that alters my decision, I will of course complete a review and communicate any changes with you. I am aware that other schools may be able to make other decisions due to their staffing and union membership so please remember that different schools will have to make different decisions.

This is the result of national issues around fully funded pay awards and working conditions between Education unions and the government - it is not due to any actions taken by the school, and it is a matter for the unions and the government to resolve independently of the school.

I realise this is not the ideal situation for you and your children, however, I would urge you to look into why the union is taking this action.
