

Areas in Green (completed) - Review

Our recently revised teaching and learning policy has ensured that all children have made good progress this year. Teaching has been graded as strong and effective.

The curriculum offer for our children is strong. It is based on evidence informed practice. The curriculum is carefully crafted to ensure children progress in their learning. Children build their knowledge systematically.

Our OPAL playtimes during the morning and lunchtime has been a huge success. The children's enjoyment at playtimes is a joy to watch. We have also held our first parent/carer stay and play session. We are looking forward to more of these.

New Wandle books were purchased and this has increased our ability to match books to children phonics knowledge.

We have developed reading fluency within our KS2 classes.

We have launched a very useful parent/carer date list for the full academic year. We have listened to some feedback on this and will make the next edition even better.

Our new writing curriculum has been rolled out across all year groups after trialling it last year. This is proving successful and writing attainment and progress is appearing to improve. Our KS1 writing outcomes are above provisional national and our KS2 writing data is in line with the provisional national data.

Our offer to support children's personal development has remained of a high standard. Ensuring our children live out the values we discuss is a high priority.

Areas in Orange (partially completed) - Review

Our attendance has been above national, however, there are some families in which attendance has remained a barrier. We will focus more on children with patterns of poor attendance for more than one academic year.

We also believe that punctuality remains a concern. It is vital that children are ready to come through the gate at 8:45am so they do not miss any learning that is completed straight away.

We are proud of how we have developed reading fluency strategies within whole class reading lessons, however, we have pinpointed a slight gap as children move from Year 2 to Year 3 and will address this next year.

Our children's multiplication knowledge has improved but not as much as we had wished. This will remain a priority for next year.

Developing business links - We link with businesses as and when needed, for example, the library, museum, Canal and Rivers Trust and local building sites, which have benefitted our children. We will continue to find other ways to do make links.

Learning Outside the Classroom (LOtC) - our curriculum has opportunities for LOtC, however, we decided not to go for the award at this time.

Areas in Red (not completed) - Review

Unfortunately, the trainer was ill and the training has had to be postponed to next academic year.
