Collective Worship - Our thinking!

Generosity continues to be our topic of thought and discussion. This week, we have thought about how we can offer our time generously.

We have thought about the collective impact if everyone gave up some time to meet with someone, clear some rubbish or tidy up an area. We discussed the importance of everyone being responsible for their time, not the few. We looked at a story from the Old Testament from the book of Nehemiah. God's people travelled back to Jerusalem, but the outside wall to protect their city had been smashed when they arrived. They worried about rebuilding taking forever to repair, but Nehemiah had a great idea - "let each family build a bit of the wall...if everyone is generous with their time and strength, the wall will soon be finished." We concluded that if everyone does their bit, it all adds up and shows love in action.



Attendance

Please remember that we aim for children to have at least 96% attendance across an academic year. Children who have attendance below 96% are of concern. Children below 90% are classed as 'Persistent Absence'. Mrs Forrest will be contacting families to arrange support as required. Punctuality

Punctuality - Please ensure children arrive at 8:45 a.m. to start their 'Do Now' tasks, an essential part of our retrieval practice. It aids the children in their learning that day. If they miss it, they are at a disadvantage to their peers who arrive on time. Minutes late each day soon add up. Five minutes late each day is equivalent to missing three days of learning across a year.
