
We continued our theme of 'diversity' with links to a couple our school rules: What has interested you during

School Uniform

he school's uniform is a unisex uniform and any items can be worn by either gender Please note 'G/W' next to an item of clothing means this is available at Grays and Whitakers uniform shop. Other items, if available and unbranded, can be bought from

Year EYFS to Year 5:

- White, blue or gold school polo shirt G/W
- · Royal Blue school sweatshirt / cardigan G/W
- Navy blue or tartan skirt or pinafore dress
- Blue check dress with white socks may be worn in the summer months
- Grey trousers / shorts
- White, navy blue or grey socks
- White or navy blue tights
- Black shoes (these can be plain black trainers for the whole week)

White shirt, school tie and a knitted navy blue jumper or cardigan;

At St Francis, children must attend school in the following PE kit on their PE days or days in which they have a sports club. This kit will also be used for educational visits if appropriate and also days involving more outdoor learning

- Gold, purple or royal green t-shirt (logo options) G/W
- Royal blue hoody or zip-up hoody (logo options) G/W
- Plain (unbranded) navy joggers or leggings
- Plain (unbranded) navy shorts
- Plain trainers (Velcro if child is not able to tie shoe laces)

A look ahead to next academic year...

This year has been all change for obvious reasons. We have had to changes elements of the school day that we would never have changed, however, some of the aspects have worked and helped the smooth running of school. Plans have not been finalised, however, the following is what is highly likely to happen:

Morning procedure: We will remain with the system of dropping children off at the gate. The gate will open at 8.45am with the absolute expectation that all children are through by 8.50am. Gates and external classroom doors will close at this time and children arriving after this time will be marked as late.

Playtime: Playtime in the morning will go back to 'normal'

Lunchtime: We will continue the current set up, however, we will look to reduce the number of outside zones to allow for one zone with a mix of children. Children will rotate through the open zone and closed zones working with a sports coach.

Afternoon collection procedure: The gate will open at 3.25pm. Children will be let out coming up to 3.30pm. Children who are still at school at 3.35pm will be taken to after-school club (ASC) and parents will be charged for a full session of ASC.

Collective Worship: We are going to have a hybrid of online and face-to-face worship. Monday and Friday will remain online and children will gather in the hall on a Wednesday and Thursday. Tuesday will remain in-class Worship.

Please note, all of the above is dependent upon national AND local guidance.

It would be very much advised to keep up some simple recall of basic mathematic skills—doubling, halving etc. Please use Purple Mash to support your times tables knowledge, including rapid recall. This will help a lot!

After-School Club (ASC) News


Please see poster for more information regarding PALS who will be running our ASC from September 2021.
