## **Uniform Decision**

#### for September 2025

Thanks to everyone who took part in the survey and shared their views.

There are clear and valid differences of opinion across all stakeholders, but the final decision is that from September 2025, there will be only one uniform. PE kit will be changed into at school on PE days.

The uniform will be:

- Grey trousers/school shirts or checked skirt/pinafore dress
- Pale blue polo shirt
- Royal blue jumper/cardigan
- Grey/white socks/tights
- Black school shoes

None of these items need to include our school logo, although Greys and Whitakers will stock the official logoed jumpers and polo shirts.

The PE kit will need to be brought into school and kept on the child's coat peg. For now, children can wear their current 'active uniform' (navy joggers. Purple/green/yellow T-Shirt and blue hoody) until they grow out of these.

Going forward, and for our new Reception children, the official PE kit will be a purple T-shirt and navy shorts/joggers.



### Start of the school day - from the summer term

As promised, we have planned for the school gates to be opened for all parents/carers before the start of the school day from next term.

The school gates will be opened at approximately 8.40am, when children and their parents/carers can walk to wait outside their classrooms until the staff have opened the classroom doors to begin the school day at 8.45am.

In order to keep everyone as safe as possible, the following points must be adhered to:

- Children (including pre-schoolers) are not to play on the field at any point before the school day.
- Parents/carers are not to follow their children into the school building.
- As soon as their child has gone inside their classroom, the parent/carer should leave.
- Parents/carers need to leave the premises at 8.50am.

#### **Persistent Absenteeism**

Children who miss 19 days in the school year (38 sessions) are classed by the Government as a persistent absentee. Children who are persistently absent from school generally don't do as well as their peers in national tests. They may also find it harder to form friendship groups.

School closely monitors every child's attendance, and will work closely with families whose children are on track to be a persistent absentee. Help and support is offered, and we ask that parents, in line with the Government's expectations, engage with school to ensure that their child doesn't miss out on their education.

From the summer term, we will be raising the profile of aiming for 100% for all our families.

Please help us with this by ensuring your child is in school on time, every day.


