As with changing for PE in school, this was stopped during covid. We are now one of the few schools across the borough still having children's lunches served to them on trays while they sit and wait at their tables, and we feel that the time has come for us to move forward with this, and have children once again having food served to them at the hatch.

Uniform Decision

for September 2025

Thanks to everyone who took part in the survey and shared their views.

There are clear and valid differences of opinion across all stakeholders, but the final decision is that from September 2025, there will be only one uniform. PE kit will be changed into at school on PE days.

The uniform will be:

- Grey trousers/school shirts or checked skirt/pinafore dress
- Pale blue polo shirt
- Royal blue jumper/cardigan
- Grey/white socks/tights
- Black school shoes

In previous years we have also allowed grey/navy skirts/skorts but as the views of stakeholders were mainly against a range of different elements to the uniform, it has been decided to only have checked skirts or pinafores to ensure consistency. None of these items need to include our school logo, although Greys and Whittakers will stock the official logoed jumpers and polo shirts.

The PE kit will need to be brought into school and kept on the child's coat peg. For now, children can wear their current 'active uniform' (navy joggers. Purple/green/yellow T-Shirt and blue hoody) until they grow out of these.

Going forward, and for our new Reception children, the official PE kit will be a purple T-shirt and navy shorts/joggers.

We know that this decision has not satisfied everyone, but in the spirit of democracy, we had to stand by the majority of stakeholders' views.

It is been wonderful to hear all the positive responses from parents since the decision was shared. We have also heard from some of our new parents, whose children will be starting with us in September, commenting on how pleased they are that their children will be wearing a smart uniform.

We are aware that for some of our children, school uniform can cause challenges with sensory issues: scratchy seams and tight waistbands for example. As an inclusive school we would never want to make a child feel uncomfortable with what they are wearing. Asda have an Easy On Easy Wear range designed for children who may need adaptive clothing, and there are some tips for making uniform more 'comfy' on the 'Sensory Smart' website.

It is important to note that the decision to have children change for PE was only a temporary measure introduced as a COVID-19 precaution. For our older children, we will ensure that they do not change in front of the opposite sex, maintaining appropriate privacy and dignity.

We believe that this change will contribute to the overall positive ethos and high standards we strive for at St. Francis CE Primary School. We are confident that our children, along with their families, will embrace this transition and continue to uphold the values and expectations of our school community.

New start-of-the-day procedures

In response to a number of parent/carers who requested for the school gates to be open a little earlier, in order to walk their children round to class in the mornings, and alleviate congestion on Cherry Tree Lane, we have started this, this week.

As always however, the safety and well-being of our pupils is our top priority. To ensure a smooth and secure start to the day, we kindly request that only children accompanied by an adult should be coming into the school grounds at 8.40am. Children and their accompanying adult should wait outside their classroom door until the official start time of 8.45am.

For those children who are not accompanied by an adult, or for those adults who do not wish to walk their child to their classrooms, we ask that they wait with their children at the school gates until it is time to go straight into school at 8.45am.

This will help us maintain a safe and supervised environment for all our pupils. Staff are not outside at 8.40am and they are not responsible for children waiting outside classrooms without an adult.

We understand that mornings can be a busy time, but we believe these measures will contribute to the overall safety and security of our school community.

To confirm:

Children with their adult can enter the school premises at 8.40am.

Classroom doors open at 8.45am and close at 8.50am.

Unsupervised children must not enter the school premises before 8.45am.
