Holiday requests and absences

As we come towards the final half-term, special leave requests for holidays and absence notifications always increase significantly.

The gov.uk website states:

- a Parenting Order
- an Education Supervision Order
- a School Attendance Order

Uniform Reminders

Our new uniform expectations for 2025-2026 are shared below on the next few pages.

In the meantime however, it is important that for the remainder of this academic year, children continue to come to school in the correct uniform; and uniform reminders and slips will be given out to those children not following our expectations next half term.

As a reminder:

- Trainers and school shoes must be plain black
- Joggers, shorts and hoodies are not to be branded
- If worn, cycle shorts must be knee-length or just above the knee also not branded
- Hair braids and 'extreme' styles are not allowed
- Earrings and other forms of jewellery are not to be worn

Royal blue jumper or cardigan Light blue polo shirt Tartan pleated skirt or pinafore dress Grey trousers or grey tailored shorts



The jumper/cardigan and polo shirts do not need to have our school logo







Black school shoes, white/black/grey socks/tights

These are available form Grays and Whittakers, but the poloshirts, jumpers and trousers can also be purchased from other suitable retailers.

Blue checked or striped dresses can be worn in the summer months

Long hair must be tied up

A small blue bow, headband or bobble can be worn





Not Allowed:

- Extreme hair styles such as ultra-shaved styles or unnatural colours
- Coloured braids
- Jewellery including earrings. Plastic earring retainers can be worn
- Make-up
- Nail varnish
- False nails or long natural nails

ASDA and other retailers now sell uniforms for children with sensory needs, with softer collars and seams. Base layers can also be worn if appropriate.
