### **Uniform 2025 – 2026**

This is a reminder that from September, all children will be expected to be wearing the 'new' uniform every day, as specified on the following pages.

There is no distinction between boys and girls: either can wear the option of grey trousers/shorts or tartan skirt/pinafore.

The PE kit, which must be left in school on the child's cloakroom peg in a suitable bag, can be the current 'active uniform' or the new PE kit. Once the active uniform no longer fits your child, please ensure all future PE kits are comprised of a purple T-Shirt and navy shorts.
