Collective Worship - This week...

This week we went back to looking at our School Christian Values, focusing on 'gentleness'.

We thought about what the word gentleness means to different people. The children generated great thoughts and shared these. Some people linked it to being asked to stroke a cat gently through to show the character of Jesus. We focused on a bible story from John 8 1-11, where a lady was brought before Jesus. The crime committed in those days was punishment by stoning. Jesus showed incredible gentleness by not condoning the behaviour, however, said "let he who has never sinned throw the first stone." Of course, there is no one who has not done wrong and therefore, the lady's life was spared. Children were asked to reflect on their thoughts, words and actions - do they convey gentlesness and show value towards other people.

Talk to your child(ren about...

Discuss with your child the following questions:

What does gentleness mean to you?

What does Christian gentleness mean?

What does gentleness look like?

Why is it important for people to show gentleness?

What would the world look like if everyone showed gentleness to each other?

What do you think about this prayer?

Eco-Warrior Update—Changes to SNACKS

Here at St. Francis we are working towards the Eco-Schools Green Flag Award. After holding meetings with our Eco-Warrior Council, it is evident that we are doing a lot to help our local environment and our planet. However, there is still lots to be done! We have 10 topics to look at under this award so we have chosen 3 main topics to improve to start with. These are litter, school grounds and energy. Litter is becoming a problem around schooland we are looking at ways to reduce it, these are:

- EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2: Morning snack will be NHS provided fruit only so there is no need to bring anything into school.
- 2) KS2 children to bring in a piece of fruit or vegetable in a reusable container.
- Packed lunches be mindful of single-use plastics and 3) packaging. Use more reusable containers
- All children to have a water bottle (not single-use plastic) in school.

These actions are now within the Eco-Warrior Council action plan to support improvement. In order to progress towards the award, the Eco-Warrior Council needs everyone to do their bit.
