Staff Appointment: Congratulations to Mrs Katie Forrest, who has been appointed to the role of Inclusion Officer. Mrs Forrest will become our 'front-facing' safeguarding lead and will continue to complete SEND assessments, emotion work with children amongst many other roles.

Staff Change: Since my previous newsletter where I outlined the staff, we have had one change to the Year 1 / 2 Teaching Assistant. This will now be a lady called Mrs C O'Neill. She has already been with us for a number of days to complete induction. We are also welcoming another Teaching Assistant in Year 2 called Mrs Aspin.

School Operation: During COVID, we had to operate differently. Some things we did not like and could not wait to get rid of them! Others, we have found work incredibly well and we are keeping them. One of these changes around the lunchtime supervision by zone (although, children will be able to mix zones), children coming through the gate at 8:45 in the morning, KS2 children eating in their classrooms and the gates opening at 3:25pm at the end of the school day. We have found many positives to this way of working. As stated in the previous newsletter, our Parent/Carer Partnership offer is in its final stage and will be available on Monday 12th September. Newsletters will move to being sent out on a Monday from September.
