


- There are significant people from the past who have changed the present.



Charles Darwin Mary Anning



Born in **1809** and died in **1882**. Spent 5 years travelling around the world on the **HMS Beagle** studying plants and animals from around the world.



This led to him writing a book called **On the Origin of Species.**



Mary Anning born 1799 and died in 1847.

Anning uncovered a complete dinosaur fossil. It turned out to be the first complete Ichthyosaur fossil to be found.



This was an important discovery because it changed the way scientists had thought the natural world had developed.
