What will I find out by the end of the unit?

- Canals in Georgian and Victorian times were used as transportation for goods such as cotton and coal. It was quicker than using horse and cart from port to mill.
- Building of the Leeds to Liverpool Canal was started in 1770 and completed in 1816.
- The Navvies dug out the trench for the canal, lined it with clay and puddled it (stamped on it with their feet and the hooves of animals e.g. sheep, cows from the fields). It then filled with rainwater.
- Horse pulled canal barges.
