



What should I already know?

- How shadows are formed;

- When drawing, shadows can make an object look 'real'

Shadow	A darker patch created by lack of light
Glass	A shiny material
Line	The outline, or implied outline, of an object
Form	A shape that has an implied 3 rd dimension
Contrast	The darkness or lightness of an object when compared with another object
