Worship Theme



We have continued to think about advent and explore the meaning of the third and fourth candle. The third candle is pink and symbolizes joy. It is called the "Shepard's Candle," and is pink because rose is a liturgical color for joy. The third Sunday of Advent is Gaudete Sunday and is meant to remind us of the joy that the world experienced at the birth of Jesus, as well as the joy that the faithful have reached the midpoint of Advent.

On the fourth week of Advent, we light the final purple candle to mark the final week of prayer and penance as we wait for the birth of our Saviour. This final candle, the "Angel's Candle," symbolizes peace. It reminds us of the message of the angels: "Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men."

The final candle to be lit will be the white candle in the centre of thr advent wreath. This candle is called the "Christ Candle" and represents the life of Christ. The colour white is for purity - because Christ is our sinless, pure Saviour.
